



Launching of the MED-AMIN

MEDiterranean Agricultural Markets Information Network

Press Release

February 11, 2014

Gathered on the 22 and 23 of January 2014 in Paris, the CIHEAM member states launched the initiative «**MED**editerranean **Agricultural Markets Information Network (MED-AMIN)**».

Participants from ministries of agriculture, statistical services or cereal offices of CIHEAM Member States attended the meeting organized at the invitation of CIHEAM and of the French ministry of Agriculture, Food Industry, and Forest (MAAF), in the headquarters of FranceAgriMer,

The meeting was marked by the intervention of the French Minister, **Stéphane le Foll** who recalled the priority given to the Mediterranean Area by his ministry, and expressed his particular interest in the establishment of this new network. The CIHEAM Secretary General, **Cosimo Lacirignola**, also participated.

The new network aims at fostering **cooperation and experience sharing among the national information systems on agricultural markets**, following the request of the CIHEAM Member States' ministers made at their 9th meeting in Malta in September 2012. It will be dedicated in a first stage to cereal products (wheat, corn, barley, and rice), that are strategic for food security in the Mediterranean countries. The name of this network is a strong signal sent by the States, because the adjective *amin* in Arabic refers of the notion of “**trust**”.

Coordinated by CIHEAM, and more specifically by its Mediterranean Agronomic Institute (MAI) of Montpellier, this regional network will operate in relation with the secretariat of the multilateral initiative **AMIS** (Agricultural Markets Information System) based in Rome, with **FAO**, and with the **European Commission**.

On the Occasion of their 10th meeting in Algeria on February 6, 2014, the ministers of agriculture of the 13 Member States of CIHEAM have officially ratified the creation of MED-AMIN, providing a great support for the development of this network as it is made clear in their final declaration (*to be consulted on www.ciheam.org*).

The network will hold its second meeting in the fall of 2014 in **Turkey**, at the invitation of the authorities of this founder member country of CIHEAM in 1962.
